

Trauma Recovery Continuum of Care



The Henry Ford Health Trauma Recovery Continuum of Care (TRCC) is an innovative approach to maximize the recovery of traumatically injured patients, families, and communities through support, mental health services, education, and access to resources.

The goal of the TRCC is to assist and support survivors through their recovery in all facets, and end the cycle of violence that plagues our communities.

Offered by the Department of Surgery, patients can expect a seamless transition between our inpatient trauma psychology service and outpatient services in the Trauma Recovery Center (TRC).

Services include:

- Clinical case management
- Care coordination across multiple systems of care
- Trauma-informed, evidence-based mental health treatment
- Evaluation of client outcomes
- Victim Services
- · Peer mentorship/counseling
- Food programs
- Safe housing/shelter
- Legal services
- Transportation
- Faith-based services
- and many more

Family and caregivers may also access services. Clients may be referred to community partners for expanded services.

Patient Flow

For trauma survivors admitted to the Trauma Surgery Service at Henry Ford Hospital, engagement begins at bedside. Survivors may be seen by our inpatient Trauma Social Work & Psychology Service. The team may assist with linkage to resources, coping, and psychoeducation. Survivors may also take advantage of peer mentorship. At discharge, survivors can then be linked to our outpatient TRC.

The TRC is open to all survivors of trauma and violent crime, regardless of where they were treated. Our clinic includes a multidisciplinary team of licensed psychologists, psychiatrist, and social workers. We offer trauma-informed, evidence-based, comprehensive behavioral health interventions.

TRC services are available for both insured and uninsured patients at no cost.

Access Services

Survivors admitted at Henry Ford Hospital may access the inpatient Trauma Social Work & Psychology Service currently as the standard of care.

Peer mentorship programming will be available later this summer.

The TRC will be available to Michigan residents 15 or older who have survived trauma or violent crime in the past three years when live in the Fall of 2024.
